# Below is a sketch of days leading up to and years following my Adelphian Academy experience.

As Thursday afternoon of Actober 25, 1956, waned the seemingly endless preparations for the move from familiar surroundings were finally completed. We considered our 1937 Nash coupe as a family member and it was packed to the max with only



enough space for me along with my parents to fit into as we set out from Calgary. Before midnight we crossed the border into Montana. On Friday night we stayed in Minot, ND, and attended church there next morning before driving on toward Grand Forks. Surrounded by the early Monday morning mist we felt the rumbling vibrations of invisible foghorns while awaiting a ferry to cross the Straits of Mackinac. Later in the day we arrived in Holly. It was near the beginning of November when my enrollment as a village student at Adelphian was the beginning of my good fortune to become linked with the AA class of '57.

My recollection is that after attending a festive evening program prior to Thanksgiving I ineptly stumbled into an exterior stairwell of the then new Weaver Auditorium. Apparently it was the next day; while I was at home with a severe headache, recuperating from the concussion of the previous night; that class-officer elections were held. On returning to school I learned that my lot was that of a sergeant-at-arms. I had no idea of the responsibilities of that office, but I no longer felt like a newcomer. It was apparent that my class had adopted me as one of its own. Not until spring though, when my Bell Echoes was signed, "Best of Luck to another ruffy. Dave", did it become clear to me that higher "Powers" had been covering for both of us all along. It is no secret that the behavior of our classmates, always above reproach, made that office for Dave Powers and me one of sheer honor.

After college at Berrien Springs I studied biochemistry at Virginia Tech. During a break between MS and PhD I worked in the chemistry section of the clinical lab at Washington Sanitarium and Hospital in Takoma, Maryland. One afternoon student nurses at Columbia Union College come to the lab to learn the technique of venipuncture. In some way my arm became the target of a needle wielded by Marilyn Murdoch. By the pain it inflicted I would judge that she first tried to draw my blood from a tendon before noticing the vein nearby! She insists that I have a low pain threshold. We were married in the Silver Spring Church. Prior to postdoctoral study in the Biochemistry Department at the University of Texus M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute at Houston I became a naturalized citizen of the United States on July 4, 1968, on the front steps of Monticello.

When I joined the Biochemistry Department at Loma Linda University, I found classmate Ann Zelenak Pearson already working there. Both of us continued working together in that department until her retirement, and for a number of those latter years it was also my privilege to serve as a deacon at the Loma Lind University church where her husband Don served as head deacon.

Now nostalgia and the opportunity to visit with my classmates draw me even more strongly to attend the 50th Adelphian Academy Class of '57 reunion than they did when I missed being at our 40th. However, as it was then, again it turns out that on the same weekend Marilyn's duties here on campus at Loma Linda University School of Nursing graduation make it impossible for her to accompany me and meet you all. But on the other hand, I noticed that the scheduled speaker for our 50th is my home church pastor and that provides an additionally enticing reason for me to attend our reunion because that would save me from having to miss one of his Sabbath morning messages! We are blessed here by his, Randy Robers, weekly sermons.
